Introduction

The **Joint Master in EU Trade & Climate Diplomacy** seeks to provide analytical and negotiation skills through evidence-based studies and practical project work on critical areas of the program: Sustainability & Climate, Trade & Investment, and Digital Cooperation. The curriculum focuses on how to act, reflect, and participate in strategic trade and climate policy negotiations between Europe and other geopolitical powers with a wide range of economic and digital intelligence tools.

Objectives

The program arms students with critical thinking and deep technical knowledge of complex bi and multilateral rule-based agreements in order to become an asset for the public, nonprofit, and private sectors in diverse fields that include policy analysis, security analysis, trade and economic development, foreign affairs and diplomacy, international finance, digital and environmental policy.

Participants

The program is intended for a new generation of policymakers from a wide range of national and cultural backgrounds that strive to enforce the EU's leadership in fair trade and climate action while serving a broader sustainability agenda of social justice.
