Alessandro Ferrara is Professor of Political Philosophy at the University of Rome Tor Vergata and teaches Legal Theory at the Department of Law of LUISS Guido Carli. He served as President of the Italian Association for Political Philosophy (2005-2010).

Academic career

He graduated in Philosophy in Italy and later, as a *Harkness Fellow*, received his Ph.D. from the University of California at Berkeley (1984). He conducted post-doctoral research in Munich and Frankfurt with Jürgen Habermas as a *Von Humboldt Fellow* and later at Berkeley again.

Prof. Ferrara has served as Director of the Ph.D. Program at the University of Rome Tor Vergata between 2008 and 2012, and as Director of the School of Journalism of the same University between 2004 and 2010.

He also served as Member of the National Committee for Habilitation in Political Philosophy, Italian Ministry of University and Education (2013–2014 and 2018-2020) and as Member of the National Group of Experts (GEV-14) for assessing the quality of research in Italy (2004-10). He has twice chaired the Panel of Experts for assessing the quality of research in the humanities in the Czech Republic (2010-14 and 2015-19).

Since 1991 Ferrara has been a Co-Director of the Yearly Prague Conference on *Philosophy and Social Science*, originally founded by Jürgen Habermas in Dubrovnik in 1976 and since 1993 held under the auspices of the Institute of Philosophy of the Czech Academy of Science. Co-Directors formerly included Jean Cohen, Axel Honneth, Frank Michelman, Seyla Benhabib, Nancy Fraser, Rainer Forst, William Scheuerman, and currently include Maeve Cooke, Simone Chambers and other distinguished colleagues.
