Joint Master in European Cultural Governance

The third edition of the Joint Master in European Cultural Governance, Master Universitario di Primo Livello (hereafter, “Joint Master or Master”) is established for the academic year 2026/2027.

Art. 1 – Description of Joint Master

The Joint Master is managed by the School of Government – Luiss Guido Carli – located at Viale Pola, 10, 00198 Rome.

The Joint Master in European Cultural Governance (EUCULTURE) is the result of a partnership between the School of Government of Luiss Guido Carli and the Centre International de Formation Européenne (CIFE). By living and learning Europe’s culture in Italy, Germany and France you connect the European traditions and history with the need for forward-thinking government and innovative cultural policies inspired by visionary artists. The huge potential of heritage-led local development and regeneration in historic cities, villages, historical houses & gardens, and the countryside across Europe can indeed become a real ‘game- changer’ towards a greener and more sustainable Europe.

The Master in European Cultural Governance aims at providing students with:

- Comprehensive understanding of Europe’ s culture to build the values and ethics of the 21st century necessary to deal with the ecological and digital transitions;
- Learning how Europe could be a model of cultural policies for sustainable development;
- In-depth knowledge of how cultural heritage relates with the wider world at all levels, with a

specific focus on climate change, social and diplomatic cooperation;

- The hands-on competences that are necessary to manage cultural projects and relations in a professional setting;
- The study of the terms of cultural agreement and negotiation essential today with the multiplication of Regional and bilateral agreements and the proliferation of cultural conflicts;
- The cultural and creative industries' dynamics and market in the digital economy;
- Learn about financial institutions and crowdfunding platform rules and actors;
- Learn professional skills in cultural exchange and diplomacy as a catalyst of connectivity among policy-makers.

Art. 2 – Academic Structure

The Joint Master requires a comprehensive academic effort of 1500 hours, which includes 320 teaching hours; the remaining hours will be devoted to personal study and the writing of the Master's thesis, corresponding to 60 ECTS. Classes are delivered in presence.

Upon reaching the required number of enrolled students, classes will start in October 2026 and finish by September 2027; this period also includes the drafting of the final Master's thesis.

The lectures will be held in Rome on one of Luiss Guido Carli's campuses. A mandatory period abroad is also foreseen as part of the program, in Berlin (Germany) and Nice (France) at the Centre International de Formation Européenne (CIFE):

- February 2027 – April 2027 at CIFE Berlin, Kielganstrasse, 4 A D - 10783 Berlin, Germany
- April 2027 – July 2027 at CIFE Nice, 81, rue de France F-06000 Nice, France

The academic program is divided into 4 modules. Each module contains different lectures for which students will be tested with a final mark expressed in 30 points (18 being the minimum). When the student's performance is considered outstanding a "laude" can be added by the Commission. For the period abroad, hence, the grading system will be converted as follow:

Students are required to attend all mandatory teaching hours as indicated in the academic program. Should they miss more than 20% of the required teaching hours, they will not complete the Master; therefore, they

will not receive the final title. There are no justified absences, except for some cases that will be individually evaluated by the Administrative Management at the express request of the Master course's Director.

Should a student miss too many teaching hours, fail tests at the end of each single subject module or is responsible of academic and professional misconduct, the Director of the Master can decide, at his/her unquestionable judgement, his/her suspension or exclusion. In both cases tuition fees will not be reimbursed. Having completed their mandatory teaching hours, students will deliver a Master's thesis based on a topic selected among those examined in the single subject modules. No thesis dissertation is planned.

Upon successfully completing all academic requirements, students will receive a final grade expressed on a grading scale of 110 points. This final grade combines the results of the tests of each single subject module and that of the Master's thesis. If the highest mark is obtained, the Commission may unanimously decide to award honours and, possibly, a special mention.

Art. 3 – Stage

The Career Services of Luiss Guido Carli creates opportunities of stage through formal agreements and regular interactions with private and public organisations. However, it does not guarantee a stage to all students of the Master. A stage, moreover, does not count towards the 60 ECTS.

Candidates for a stage are independently selected by hosting organisations. Should an organisation offer a stage to a student, it needs to sign a “Training and Professional Orientation Agreement” (convenzione di formazione e orientamento) with Luiss Guido Carli as required by the Italian legislation.

Stage is not an employment contract with the hosting organisation nor does it give rise to claims for future financial compensations or hiring. It can be carried out in one of the structures already affiliated with the University, or in another structure indicated by the student to be affiliated, subject to the authorisation of the Master's Director.

Art. 4 – Number of participants and Academic Calendar

The number of participants of the Joint Master is limited. The Joint Master is activated with 10 enrolled students. Classes are held during the weekdays (Monday-Friday), depending on a scheduled calendar (with the option of scheduling optional seminars and courses on Saturday mornings). The course schedule, established by the Master Directors in accordance with organizational and educational needs, will be communicated to enrolled students before the start of the course and may be subject to changes, without altering the course content.

Luiss Guido Carli, through the School of Government, for organizational reasons and at its own unquestionable judgement, reserves the right to cancel the course, notifying interested parties via e-mail to the addresses specified in the application form within the fifth day prior to the scheduled date of start of the Program.

In such cases, the registration fees received will be reimbursed within 60 days from the cancellation notification, excluding any further charge or obligation of reimbursement and/or compensation on behalf of Luiss Guido Carli.

Luiss Guido Carli, through the School of Government, also reserves the right to vary the calendars and shifts of the lessons, as well as to modify the programs, without however altering the contents. It is also entitled to replace teachers and/or supervisors in the event of unforeseen events and/or impediments.

Art. 5 – Admission Criteria

In order to apply for the 2026/2027 academic year, applicants must hold at least a Bachelor's degree or an equivalent degree awarded by a foreign university. Students at the final year of their undergraduate degree can be admitted, with reserve, provided they obtain the qualification required to attend the Master's programme within the 2025/2026 academic year, namely the extraordinary examination session (March/April 2027). To find which is the extraordinary session applicable for completing their academic

requirements, each student should refer to the regulations of their respective university regulations.

Art. 6 – Application Procedures

Applications are submitted online through the online form: <http://cloudserverjsa.luiss.it/LGCScuole/?CDS=EUCULTURE> on the Luiss official website by the deadline indicated on the webpage of the Master, under penalty of exclusion from the selection. Applicants need to attach the following documents:

- Copy of an identity document (passport or National ID Card where applicable);
- Photocopy of academic transcripts with details of exams, grades and academic credits;
- Detailed copy of Curriculum vitae et studiorum (CV);
- Motivation letter explaining the candidate’s motivation for attending the master;
- Where applicable, a certificate of English proficiency (TOEFL, IELTS or by another recognised language institute);
- Additional documents to be evaluated for the admission (e.g. a reference letter or contact of a potential referee).

Upon uploading these documents, students receive an email from: LuissGuidoCarli@luiss.it confirming the safe and correct submission of their application.

Art. 7 – Selections and Admission

Admission to the Joint Master is dependent upon the positive evaluation of the curriculum vitae et studiorum (CV) and English language skills, as well as an interview. It is possible, in particular cases, to be interviewed over the phone or videoconference. Selections are undertaken by a Committee appointed by the Director of the Master.

Applicants will be invited for an interview via email sent to the address indicated in their application. Similarly, the result of their selection procedure (admission, exclusion or reserve) will also be communicated by email at the same address. An enrollment form and full payment instructions are sent to all admitted students.

Art. 8 - Admission for foreign students and/or students with foreign academic qualifications

Foreign students, after assessing and confirming the eligibility of the academic qualifications submitted, they must apply to the Embassy/Consulate of their country of residence to carry out all the necessary operations required by the Italian Ministry of University and Research and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. International students must also apply for pre-registration on the UniversItaly portal ([UniversItaly - Italian University just a click away](#)).

Foreign academic degrees must be accompanied by the following documentation for proper evaluation:

- for degrees awarded in the European Union: Diploma Supplement;
- for non-European Union degrees: declaration of value issued by the Italian Embassy (namely the Embassy of the country to which the degree refers);

Otherwise for both types of degrees (EU and non-EU): certificate of comparability of degrees issued by CIMEA (<https://www.cimea.it/EN/pagina-attestat-di-comparabilita-e-verifica-dei-titoli>).

Art. 8.1 – Admission of students who have not completed their undergraduate studies at the moment of the application

Students who are due to graduate will be considered “admitted with reserve” on the Master’s programme. They must promptly notify the university upon obtaining their Bachelor’s degree or an equivalent foreign qualification, which must be obtained without fail by the extraordinary examination session of the 2025/2026

academic year (March/April 2027). To find which is the extraordinary session applicable for completing their academic requirements, each student should refer to the regulations of their respective university regulations. The enrolment of final-year undergraduates is to be considered “conditional” solely for the purpose of obtaining the degree and not for administrative obligations.

Failure to obtain the degree required for admission to the Master’s programme within the above-mentioned deadlines will result in the cancellation of enrolment.

Students enrolled “with reserve” are not eligible to obtain certificates attesting to their enrolment in the Master’s programme or their academic progress, nor are they permitted to sit the final examination for the award of the Diploma.

Art. 9 – Enrolment

Tuition fee of the Joint Master is set at EUR 11.000,00 (eleven thousand). Students can be granted a 10% Early Bird discount applying before a set date as stated on the webpage of the Master. Payment of the tuition fee is carried out according to the following procedures:

- Payment, within the deadline specified in the admission e-mail, of the first installment of EUR 5.500,00 (five-thousand and five-hundred) and of the revenue stamp of EUR 48.00 (fourty-eight);
- The second installment, of equal amount, will have to be paid to the partner institution in compliance with its instructions.

Enrolment will be considered finalized upon uploading the enrolment form on [Luiss Web Self-Service](#) platform and upon paying the tuition fee. Guidelines on uploading and payment will be sent with the admission e-mail.

The tuition fee is non-refundable unless the Master is not activated as the minimum number of participants is not reached. Students can also decide to withdraw from the course prior to the start of the Master, as indicated in Article 10. In both cases, Luiss’s Administration will reimburse all funds paid until that moment.

Luiss Guido Carli will issue an invoice in the name of the participants for each payment of the tuition fee.

Art. 10 – Withdrawal

Admitted students can withdraw from the Joint Master only before the official start of the academic program set by the Director of the Master, as to offer the place to a candidate in the “reserve” list.

Withdrawals need to be officially communicated in writing to the Director of the Joint Master and the Secretariat of the School of Government Luiss Guido Carli. Any request for withdrawal after the start date of the academic program does not exonerate from the payment of the entire amount of the tuition fee.

Should any admitted participant withdraw before the start of classes, any “reserves” (eligible but not admitted students) will be contacted, following a chronological criterion with regard to application submission.

Art. 11 – Financial Aid

In order to facilitate their attendance of the Joint Master, students can apply to loans (Prestiti d’ Onore) offered by various financial institutions that have stipulated agreements with Luiss Guido Carli. Art. 12 – Awarding of the title

The awarding of the degree is subject to passing exams of each single subject module and to the evaluation of the Master’s thesis, as well as the attendance of at least 80% of teaching hours. Finally, students should also have completed the payment of the tuition fee and return all the necessary documentation required to complete the registration for the Master.

Art. 13 – Protection of Personal Data

Luiss - Libera Università Internazionale degli Studi Sociali Guido Carli, as Controller, collects and processes data subjects' information in full compliance with the general principles and rules laid down by the law governing the protection of personal data (Legislative Decree No. 196/03 and Regulation (EU) No. 2016/679). The processing is required to correctly manage the procedures inherent in the call for applications in relation to the Joint Master in European Cultural Governance as well as associated and ensuing obligations: the characteristics of the processing are communicated through a privacy notice given to the data subjects, who are also requested to consent to the processing of their data should it prove necessary in relation to the aims pursued by the Controller.

Data subjects may at all times exercise their statutory rights (concerning, for example, access to data, rectification of data, erasure of data, restrictions on processing of data and portability of data) by contacting the Controller Luiss Guido Carli at Viale Pola 12, 00198 Rome, Italy, e-mail privacy@luiss.it.

Art. 14 – Students' obligations

- All those enrolled at the University are required to fulfil the educational commitments undertaken at the moment of the enrolment. They are also required to behave in a manner that respects the profitable performance of teaching activities and the regular performance of profit tests, personal integrity, the dignity of others and the integrity of the decorum of the places where teaching and university life in general takes place. The violation of the aforementioned behavioral duties entails the student's disciplinary responsibility without prejudice to any further sanctions provided for by law.
- Class attendance is compulsory, with strict adherence to class schedules;
- The student is obliged to be available for verification of attendance in accordance with the established modalities.
- In order to be admitted to the final examination, it is necessary:
 - being in order with the documents to be submitted and the payment of the tuition fee;
 - having attended at least 80% of the teaching hours envisaged in the course programme.

Art. 15 – Authentic text

Academic Program

Stretching over one academic year the program¹ is structured into four modules:

- **The Governance of Cultural Policies** at Luiss School of Government in Rome
- **Central & Eastern European culture and sustainable development** at Centre International de Formation Européenne in Berlin
- **Western European culture and the digital transition** at Centre International de Formation Européenne in Nice
- **Applied Research Methodology**, case studies, simulation exercises and skills workshops

All courses include an assessment test, with a final mark expressed in 30 points. The teaching programme may be subject to change at the discretion of the Master's Director, without altering the course content.
