

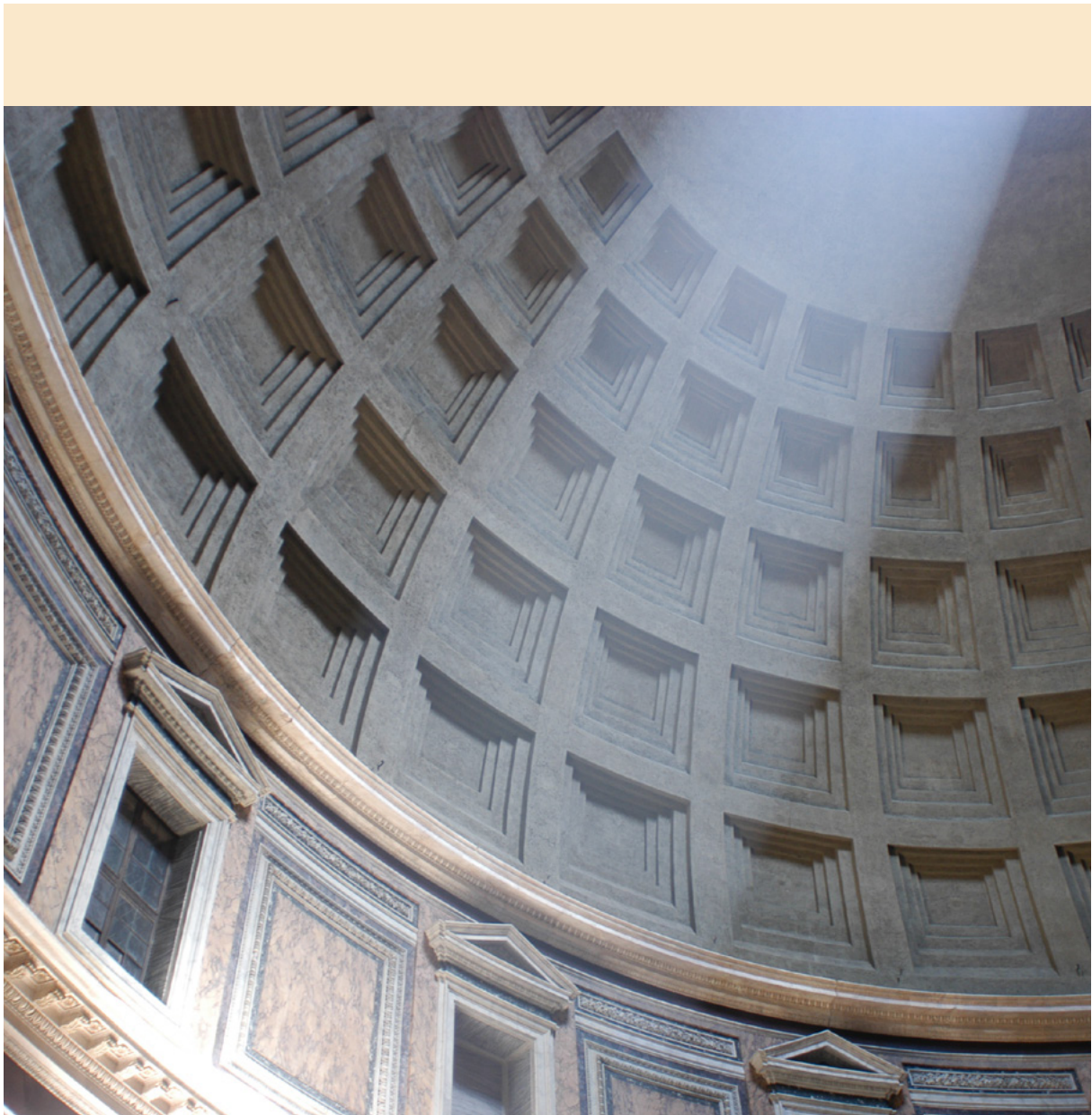

Joint Master in European Cultural Governance



The Joint Master in European Cultural Governance aims to develop students' ability to analyze, manage, and shape cultural policy through evidence-based learning and practical project work in key areas of the program: Cultural Heritage, Sustainable Development and the Digital Transition.

This one-year program takes place across Rome, Berlin, and Nice, and is taught in English. By studying and experiencing Europe's culture, participants connect European traditions and history with the need for forward-looking governance and innovative cultural policies inspired by visionary artists.

At the end of the program, graduates will be prepared to lead and manage cultural heritage and creative projects in organizations at European and local levels.

OBJECTIVES

The Master in European Cultural Governance aims at providing students with:

- Hands-on competencies to manage cultural projects and protect cultural heritage in a professional setting
- An understanding of ongoing digital innovation in the cultural and creative industries
- Professional skills for cultural diplomacy and developing and managing multi-cultural cooperations

PARTICIPANTS

Students who successfully complete the program are awarded three certifications at the end of the academic year:

Master in European Cultural Governance (CIFE)

This diploma is issued by CIFE, a private higher education institute, and certifies the successful completion of the academic curriculum. It grants 60 ECTS credits at Master's level.

Master in European Cultural Governance (Luiss University)

This diploma is issued by Luiss University, a private higher education institution, and certifies the successful completion of the academic curriculum. It grants 60 ECTS credits at Master's level.

Degree Qualification: Chargé de Mission en Organisations Européennes et Internationales (Policy Officer in European and International Organisations)
 This qualification is recognized by the French State as a Master's level degree (Level 7 of the European Qualifications Framework, EQF).

The Master is designed for graduate students holding at least a three-year Bachelor's degree, preferably – though not exclusively – in the life and social sciences, culture, history, law, politics, or economics.

It prepares graduates for careers in:

- Offices of the European Union handling cultural relations;
- Cultural services of both European and extra-European states;
- International, European, national, and local administrations managing cultural policies;
- Public-private enterprises in the cultural sector, including museums and cultural institutions;
- The financial sector supporting cultural and creative industries;
- Think tanks and NGOs working on cultural policies and heritage;
- Collective and institutional cultural stakeholders.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Students must have obtained a three-year bachelor's degree

- where applicable, a certificate of English proficiency (TOEFL, IELTS or by another recognized language institute)
- a copy of the applicant's national identity card or passport
