

**Managing the transition:  
Governance and implementation of sustainable development towards 2030**

**SCHOLARSHIP**

**ART.1 - SUBJECT**

**Luiss Guido Carli School of Government**

School of Government (SoG) Luiss Guido Carli is a graduate school training high-level public and private officials to handle political and governmental decision-making processes. Founded in 2010, SoG has become one of the leading institutions in Europe for teaching and research.

Based on a faculty of Luiss professors and researchers with an excellent academic reputation, SoG involves faculty from the main national and international universities in its post-graduate programs as well as civil servants, senior managers and directors. SoG provides theoretical and hands-on skills of good government. ## **ART.2 OBJECT**

LuiSS School of Government and PwC TLS have joined forces to organize an executive program aimed at educating a new generation of policy-makers, stakeholders, public managers and analysts by offering a program called *Managing the transition:*

*Governance and implementation of sustainable development towards 2030.*

The program is structured along 3 intensive modules, to be held on the following dates:

- 28<sup>th</sup> MAY 2021
- 4<sup>th</sup> JUNE 2021
- 11<sup>th</sup> JUNE 2021
- 18<sup>th</sup> JUNE 2021

Attendance to all 3 modules is mandatory.

The LUISS School of Government is pleased to announce ten (10) scholarships for applicants interested in attending this executive program. The scholarships consist of exemption from the payment of tuition fees for a value of EUR 1,500 (one thousand fifty hundred). The activities of the course are planned considering distance learning as the modality foreseen for the supply of the course and the course material, as reported in detail in the following pages.

## **ART.3 – REQUIREMENTS**

The course is open to governmental officers, researchers, analysts, technicians and stakeholders who are willing to further their knowledge of the Agenda 2030 UN Sustainable Development Goals and to strengthen capabilities related to the designing, planning and implementing of actions to achieve specific targets.

To participate in the selection procedure for these scholarships, candidates need to satisfy the following:

- An EU first cycle university degree or equivalent (laurea triennale o titolo equivalente straniero);

Competences

- Knowledge of English with a minimum level of B2;
- Professional motivation for attending this course.

Discounts

10% discount for alumni, LUISS students and participants arising from PwC and the Visentini Foundation, with discounts increased to 20% for the latter two categories of students in the case of applications of more than 4 people



## **ART.4 – APPLICATION**

Applicants are required to send all of the following documentation through the [online form](#):

- Luiss Scholarship application form;
- CV or resume;
- motivation letter explaining the candidate's motivation for attending the course;
- university transcript (certificato di laurea con lista degli esami);
- a reference letter (or contact of a potential referee);
- where applicable, a certificate of English proficiency;
- a copy of the applicant's national identity card or passport.

## **ART.5 – EVALUATION CRITERIA**

The awarding of the 10 scholarships will be undertaken by assessing, for each candidate, the academic degree, professional curriculum vitae (CV), level of knowledge of English, and the submitted motivation letter.

Candidates will be ranked according to the following grading scale:

- Academic degree: up to 30 points
- Professional CV: up to 30 points
- Level of knowledge of English: up to 20 points
- Motivation letter: up to 20 points

The minimum score required is 60 points.

## **ART.6 – RESULTS AND FORMAL ACCEPTANCE**

The final ranking of applications will be drawn up by a Selection Committee composed of representatives from Luiss School of Government and PwC TLS Avvocati e Commercialisti (PwC TLS), formally nominated by the Director of the School of Government.

The Selection Committee shall verify the formal regularity of the documents and announce the winners of the ten scholarships. The Selection Committee bears full responsibility for the selection procedure and its outcome.

Winners will be informed using the email contact indicated in the application. A reserve list of candidates will also be prepared.

Within three days of the date of communication, the winners must send to the Luiss School of Government their formal acceptance and any other requested documents. Upon failing to do so, the Selection Committee will offer the position to the first candidate on the reserve list.



## **ART.7 – SCHOLARSHIP RULES**

Participants who are awarded scholarships will be exempt from the payment of the tuition fee. Nevertheless, the following conditions apply:

- Enrolment in the Executive Program,
- Attendance to all the modules of the program, guaranteeing punctual arrival and full attendance of classes, to be verified on an ongoing basis;

## **ART.8 – CHECKS**

Luiss School of Government reserves the right to carry out stringent checks on the applications. In the case of any discrepancy between what has been declared and what has been verified, the scholarship shall be withdrawn and any further action envisaged by the law initiated.

## **ART.9 – PROCESSING OF PERSONAL DATA**
